Collocations, Idioms and Phrasal Verbs IN CONTEXT Collocations A collocation (also collocates) is a word or phrase which is frequently used with another word or phrase, in a way that sounds correct to speakers of the language For example, heavy rain Idioms An expression whose meaning is different from the meaning of the individual words
